

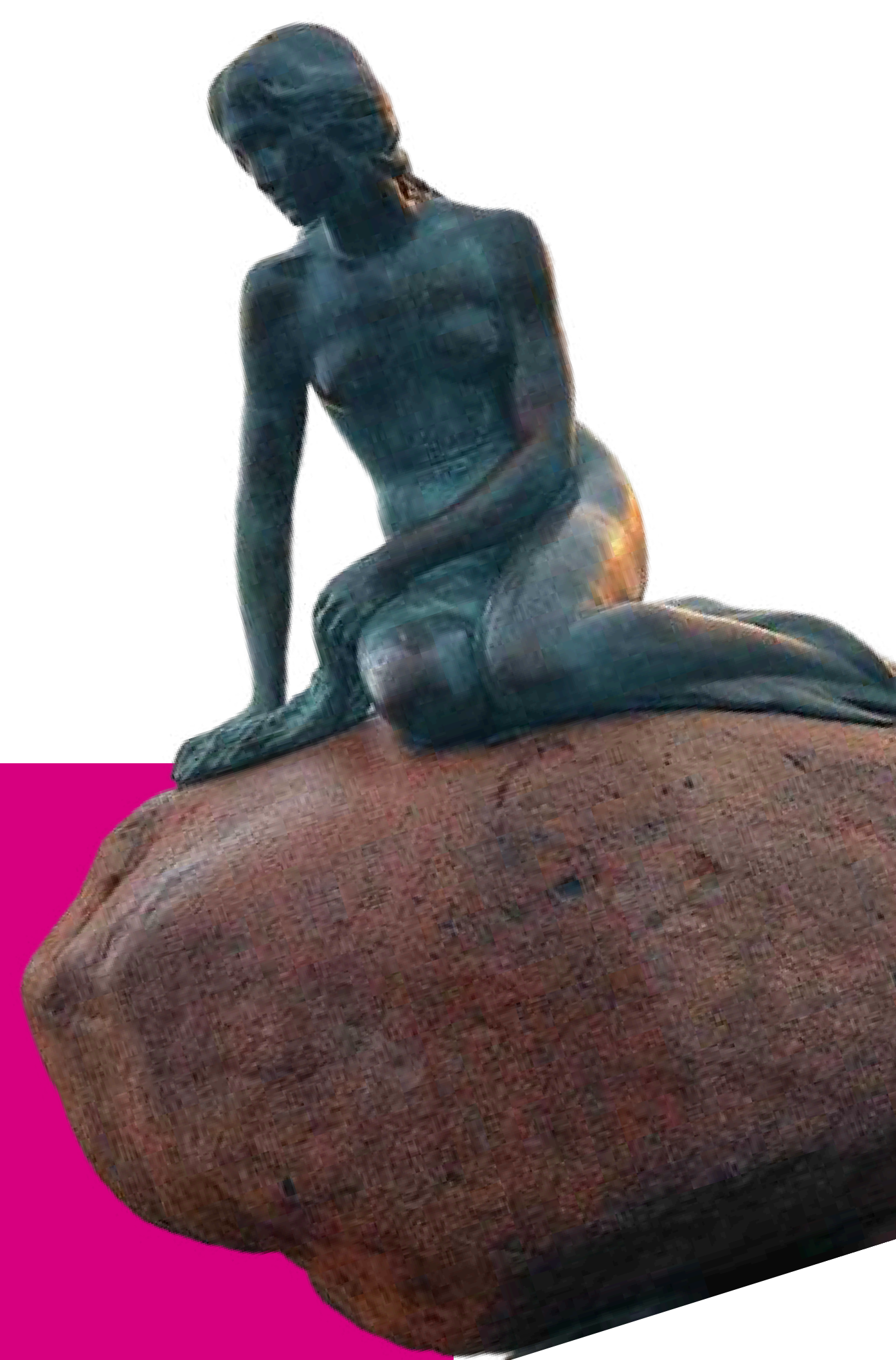

Top things to do in Copenhagen

- Stroll along Nyhavn Harbor with its colorful houses
- Walk down Strøget Street – the longest pedestrian street in Europe
- Explore Slotsholmen Island, where the city once began
- Climb the spiral ramp to the observation deck of the Round Tower (Rundetårn)
- Be amazed by the luxury of Christiansborg Palace
- Ride a bike through the city – there are more bikes than residents
- Admire the bronze statue of The Little Mermaid
- Enjoy the rides at Tivoli Gardens amusement park
- Watch the Changing of the Guard at noon at Amalienborg Palace
- Capture moments in the cozy Rosenborg Castle
- Discover treasures inside the historic building and the black cube-shaped “Black Diamond” wing of the Royal Library
- Visit the Ny Carlsberg Glyptotek Museum
- Admire the canals and floating houses of Christianshavn, the heart of the old city
- See the world’s most accurate astronomical clock at the City Hall on Rådhuspladsen
- Visit the “state within a state” – the free town of Christiania
- Immerse yourself in art at the National Gallery of Denmark
- Attend a performance at the Opera House
- Try oysters and other local produce at the Torvehallerne Market
- Take a boat tour around the city
- Explore the world of nature in the Botanical Garden and don’t miss the Palm House greenhouse





What to bring home

- **A LEGO set – Denmark is the birthplace of the world-famous toy**
- **Royal Copenhagen porcelain**
- **Local sweets: licorice, candies from the Sømods**
- **Bolchers brand, or Flødeboller – a marshmallow-like treat**
- **A figurine of The Little Mermaid or fairy tales by Hans Christian Andersen**



What to try

- **Danish open-faced sandwiches – Smørrebrød**
- **Kødboller – Danish meatballs**
- **Kokt torsk – Boiled cod**
- **Pickled herring**
- **A “Danish” pastry, known locally as Wienerbrød**
